The funds and timeframes for these programs are limited to the next few months.

SDSU recently announced it will not open for the Fall 2020 semester, so fewer students will be in the area.

As we get out of isolation and get back into something like our regular routines, let's support our local businesses and their employees.

Add one of the restaurants in the area to your weekly schedule and frequent the services of the businesses. If we do not support these businesses, we will find it increasingly difficult to get other businesses we want and the Blvd could become more of the businesses we do not want.

**THINGS MAY OPEN MORE QUICKLY
THAN WE FIRST THOUGHT – YEAH!**

Things related to Coronavirus are changing very quickly, so don't be surprised if what you hear one day changes a few days later.

- By following established guidelines and having operating plans in place, restaurants can now have dine-in customers; offices can get their employees out of the house and back to the office. Lakes and reservoirs are opening again.

- San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer and Board of Supervisors Chairman Greg Cox sent a letter to Governor Gavin Newsom on May 11 Monday, urging him to give San Diego County the authority to open sections of its economy as its leaders see fit.

Faulconer posted a copy of the letter on his Twitter page and wrote: "Urging the Governor to give consistent and achievable metrics for a safe reopen. Some state requirements aren't realistic and would keep folks unemployed for many months if left in place. This isn't about returning to normal. It's about letting us get started with the new normal."

- San Diego's Sorrento Therapeutics may have developed a cure for COVID-19. Different from a vaccination, the cure is looking great for getting rid of COVID-19 if you get it but does not prevent one from getting it.

SAN DIEGO CITY COUNCIL STILL DOING BUSINESS

The City Council is continuing to hold regular meetings with some new participation rules. Agendas and minutes are available at <https://www.sandiego.gov/city-clerk/officialdocs/council-agendas-minutes-results>

Until further notice, meetings will be conducted pursuant to the provisions of California Executive Order 29-20, which suspends certain requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act and the Temporary Rules of Council as approved on April 7, 2020.

In accordance with the Executive Order, there will be no members of the public participating in person at the City Council Meetings. Members of the public may participate and provide comment via telephone, using the City Clerk webform, email submission or via U.S. Mail of written materials, as follows:

Phone in Testimony: When the Clerk introduces either the item you would like to comment on or the comment period for, Non-Agenda Public Comment or Closed Session Public Comment, follow the instructions within the "Public Comment Instructions" by dialing the number below to be placed in the queue.

DIAL 619-541-6310 – Enter Access Code: 877861 `#`.

Written Comment through Webform: Comment on Agenda items submitted via [webform](#) - Indicate the agenda item number for which you wish to submit your comment. Comments received by the start of the meeting will be distributed to the City Council and posted online with the meeting materials. [webform](#) comments are limited to 200 words.

Written Materials. Submit written materials for submission into the record or attachments to your comment, by email to cityclerk@sandiego.gov or U.S. Mail to 202 C Street, MS2A San Diego, CA 92101. Materials submitted via e-mail will be distributed in accordance with the deadlines described above. Materials submitted via U.S. Mail will need to be received the business day prior in order for it to be distributed to the City Council.

Qualified and interested citizens are being sought to serve on the City of San Diego Redistricting Commission. The application can be found at https://www.sandiego.gov/sites/default/files/2020_redistricting_commission_application_packet.pdf.

Please note, there are **three parts to the application**: 1. **Application Form**; 2. **Disclosure forms**; 3. **Statement of Economic Interests** (Form 700) to disclose personal assets and income; this form is a public document.

The application packet found on the above link must be filled out, printed, signed, and returned to the Office of the City Clerk **via mail with original signatures**, postmarked by June 30, 2020.

If you require additional space for any of the sections in the application including the 300-word statement regarding qualification, please add those as attachments to your application when submitting.
